<p>Is there waste on the plot? Have new waste materials been brought onto the site?</p> <p>Carpet, double glazing, timber, doors, tyres and building/landscaping materials should be noted.</p>	
<p>Is the shed fit for purpose?. Is the shed in a dangerous state and possible safety risk to anyone visiting the plot?</p>
